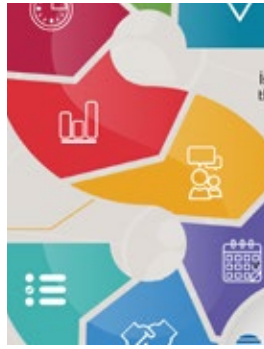

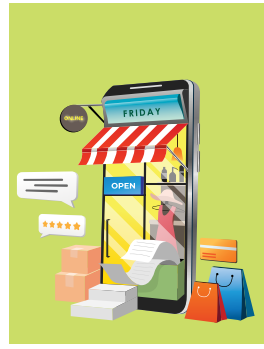

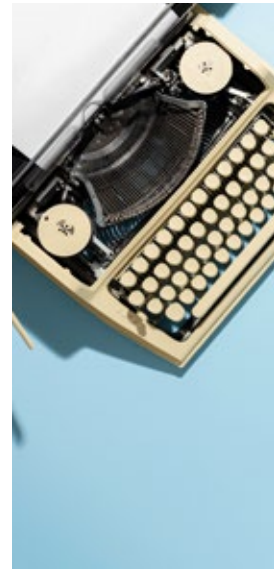

Message of the Chairman of the Board of Directors

It gives me great pleasure to present the Annual Report of the Standards and Metrology

Institute for Islamic Countries (SMIIC) for the year 2024, which reflects a year full of achievements and progress in serving our Member States and enhancing the quality infrastructure across the Islamic world.

The year 2024 witnessed an important expansion in SMIIC's membership, reaching 48 Member States, including 3 Observers, strengthening its position as a leading platform for harmonized standards, metrology and quality, and as a driver of economic integration among Islamic countries.

During the year, SMIIC published a total of 58 OIC/SMIIC standards, including 20 halal-related standards. The Institute also advanced several key initiatives such as the review of conformity and accreditation standards and studying the launch of the Islamic Countries Quality Award. Furthermore, SMIIC made a major leap in the technical activities by integrating artificial intelligence tools into its technical workstreams, which enhanced innovation, efficiency, and the overall quality of standards development.

Within its capacity-building framework, SMIIC organized 28 training programs that benefited 1,411 participants from various Member States, and launched the SMIIC Academy, which serves as a sustainable platform for knowledge dissemination and professional development.

Additionally, 59 official meetings were convened, gathering 326 experts from 27 countries and organizations, including 480 women participants, reflecting SMIIC's commitment to inclusiveness and empowerment.

On the global stage, Istanbul hosted the 10th World Halal Summit and Halal Expo 2024, with the participation of 500 exhibitors from 50 countries, and attendance exceeding 50,000 visitors from 110 nations. These landmark events reaffirmed SMIIC's pivotal role in promoting the halal economy and strengthening its global presence.

The accomplishments of 2024 represent a significant step toward achieving Standards and Metrology Institute for Islamic Countries (SMIIC)'s Vision 2030, which seeks to establish a unified ecosystem of standards, metrology, and quality that protects consumers, facilitates trade, and supports sustainable economic development across the Islamic world.

The Board of Directors reaffirms its unwavering commitment to continuing this journey, enhancing cooperation among Member States, and strengthening collaboration with international partners to achieve a more integrated and prosperous future for the Islamic Ummah.

On this occasion, I am pleased to extend my sincere appreciation to all Member States and to the General Secretariat for their dedicated efforts and constructive cooperation, which have contributed to these tangible achievements and supported SMIIC's continued progress toward its strategic goals.

In 2024, SMIIC successfully concluded the second bi-annual implementation plan and completed a revision of the SMIIC Strategic Plan 2021–2030. As a young and dynamic intergovernmental organization, we continuously strive to respond to the growing needs of our members while upholding the principles of quality, transparency, and collaboration.

The past year was marked by a number of notable achievements. SMIIC conducted 16 capacity building trainings in the field of metrology and organized 10 trainings on the introduction to and use of the SMIIC Information System. Additionally, 12 specialized training programs were held on OIC/SMIIC Halal Standards to support their consistent and effective application across the Member States. These efforts culminated in the COMSTECH-SMIIC Training Course on Halal Product Standards and Testing, held in Rabat and Mohammedia, Kingdom of Morocco, further promoting the harmonization and understanding of halal standards within the region.

To date, SMIIC has published 58 OIC/SMIIC Standards, with 20 of them dedicated to halal-related topics. These standards continue to serve as vital tools for building trust, facilitating trade, and strengthening technical cooperation among OIC countries.

Looking ahead, SMIIC remains dedicated to building a stronger, more interconnected standards and metrology framework for the benefit of all its members. We will continue to expand our services, enhance our training programs, and develop relevant standards in response to regional and global needs.

I extend my sincere gratitude to all Member States, technical experts, and partners who have contributed to our success. With your continued support, we are confident in our ability to make even greater strides in 2025 and beyond.

INTRODUCTION

This report provides a summary of the activities that have been carried out by SMIIIC for the period of 01 January – 31 December 2024 and is submitted by the SMIIIC General Secretariat. It highlights the key achievements, ongoing projects, and strategic objectives that demonstrate SMIIIC's commitment to harmonizing standards and metrology practices. It also reflects the collective efforts of our member countries and partners, whose collaboration remains central to our success. We look ahead with optimism and determination to further advance our mission in 2025 and beyond.

SMIIIC is a member-focused intergovernmental organization that strives to achieve the goals and objectives set out in its internal documents and strategic plan.

SMIIIC successfully completed the second bi-annual implementation plan and revision of its SMIIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030. The year 2024 was an active and fruitful year. While SMIIIC continued its usual operations, the institute also introduced new activities in the fields of training, metrology, and accreditation. Being a young organization, SMIIIC strives to remain dynamic and to meet the needs of its growing number of members.

Simultaneously, 16 capacity building trainings in the field of metrology and organized 10 trainings on the introduction of the SMIIIC Information System. SMIIIC has organized 12 training programs on the OIC/SMIIIC Halal Standards in order to aid the common use of standards within the OIC region. SMIIIC is conducting a series of trainings focusing on the knowledge and understanding of the OIC/SMIIIC standards, requirements, and implementation. Simultaneously, the standards development trainings are also conducted to enhance technical committee work. COMSTECH-SMIIIC Training Course on "OIC/SMIIIC Halal Products Standards and Testing: Food, Pharmaceuticals and Cosmetics" was held between 20-24 May 2024 in Rabat and Mohammedia, Kingdom of Morocco, for Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) and SMIIIC members in the Arab region, in partnership with COMSTECH Secretariat and Institute Marocain de Normalization (IMANOR) to encourage the harmonization of halal standards used in the OIC Member States and internationally by aiding in the adoption and use of the OIC/SMIIIC halal standards, also transfer experience as well as equip participants with the latest analytic skills in halal testing.

SMIIIC has continued to work on the development of the much-needed common standards in the OIC and to date has published 58 (fifty-eight) OIC/SMIIIC Standards, 20 (twenty) of them on halal issues.

SMIIC Family

The SMIIC family has grown this year, with the addition of the Togolese Republic as a new member state, to 48 Member States including 3 observers from 4 different continents. As an intergovernmental organization, SMIIC takes great pride in its ever-growing number of members. SMIIC will constantly strive to play a vital role in its field of activities.

The internal structure of the Institute comprises the following organs:





General Assembly

The General Assembly is the supreme decision-making organ of the SMIIIC and is composed of the Member States.

The SMIIIC General Assembly is a yearly gathering of SMIIIC where all our members come together for an annual meeting to discuss and decide on resolutions, reports, and projects.

The 19th SMIIIC General Assembly (GA) Meeting was held in İstanbul, Türkiye on 13 November 2024 during the SMIIIC Meetings 2024, with the attendance of 29 Member States and 3 Observers. SMIIIC committees and councils, including the Finance Committee (FC), Strategy Committee (SC), Standardization Management Council (SMC), and the Board of Directors (BOD), ordinarily held their meetings prior to the 19th SMIIIC GA meeting. The General Assembly received messages and addresses from distinguished leaders, emphasizing the importance of collaboration and partnership in standardization. Notable contributions included:



1. **H.E. Mehmet Fatih Kacir**, Minister of Science and Technology of the Republic of Türkiye, extended a recorded message, expressing support for SMIIIC's initiatives.
2. **H.E. Hissein Brahim Taha**, Secretary-General of the OIC, conveyed a message through Mr. Naghi Jabbarov, Director General of Economic Affairs, underscoring the essential role of SMIIIC standards.
3. **H.E. Dr. Hermogene Nsengimana**, Secretary-General of ARSO, delivered a keynote on the ARSO-SMIIIC cooperation.
4. **H.E. Mr. Sergio Mujica**, ISO Secretary-General, delivered a message through Mr. Collins Wafula, ISO Regional Coordinator for Africa and the Arab States.
5. **H.E. Eng. Nawaf Ibrahim Al-Mana**, President of the GCC Standardization Organization (GSO), highlighted the ongoing collaboration between GSO and SMIIIC.
6. **H.E. Dr. Adel Al-Keaid**, Chairman of IFHAB's Executive Committee, shared insights into the partnership between IFHAB and SMIIIC.



These speeches highlighted the critical alliances and partnerships that drive the success of SMIIIC in advancing global standards and fostering economic growth among member states.

Additionally, H.E. İhsan ÖVÜT was re-elected as the Secretary General for another three-year term. His continued leadership promises to strengthen SMIIIC's mission of enhancing standardization and conformity assessment across member states, fostering collaboration, and promoting economic development within the OIC community.

The Secretary General briefed the General Assembly on the latest developments and activities of SMIIIC as well as summarized the activities of SMIIIC Councils, Technical Committees, Strategic Plan implementation, and other important activities conducted since the 18th SMIIIC General Assembly Meeting. Technical activities of the Councils were reported by the Chairs of the SMIIIC Councils. The report of the External Financial Auditor 2023 was approved.

Board of Directors

The Board of Directors of the SMIIIC is the organ entrusted with the supervision of the execution of the programs, plans, and activities of the Institute. The Board of Directors comprises thirteen members, including the host country as the permanent member, elected by the General Assembly, on the basis of an equitable geographic distribution, for a term of three years.

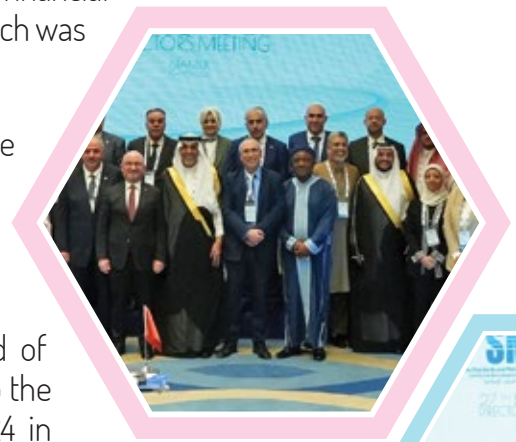


The Twenty-Seventh Meeting of the SMIIIC Board of Directors (BOD) was held on 30 April 2024 in İstanbul, Republic of Türkiye. The meeting was attended by representatives from 11 Member States of the Board of Directors.

The Secretary General briefed the Board by providing information on the activities and developments of the General Secretariat, SMIIIC Councils, Technical Committees, and other important activities since the 26th SMIIIC Board of Directors Meeting. The Secretary General also reported the progress of the implementation and achievement of all the goals in the SMIIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030. The General Secretariat briefed the Board on the Annual Progress Report 2023 on the Two-Year Implementation Plan (2023-2024). The General Secretariat also presented the Quarterly Progress Report (January-March 2024) on the Two-Year Implementation Plan (2023-2024) of SMIIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030. Reports of the SMIIIC Councils were presented by their Chairs. The external financial auditor presented its SMIIIC 2023 Financial Report to the Board which was then recommended for approval to the General Assembly.

The Board also approved the SMIIIC Annual Report 2023 which will be submitted to the OIC and shared with SMIIIC Member and Observer States, sister OIC institutions, and partner organizations and will also be used as a general promotion document with the public.

As a tradition, the Twenty-Eighth Meeting of the SMIIIC Board of Directors (BOD) was held on 13 November 2024, one day prior to the 18th General Assembly which was held on 12 November 2024 in İstanbul, Republic of Türkiye, following the regular meetings of Board of Directors Finance and Strategy Committees which were organized a day prior on 11 November 2024 as part of the SMIIIC Meetings 2024.



The meeting was chaired by H.E. Dr. Saad bin Othman AL-KASABI, Chairman of the SMIC Board of Directors (BOD). The meeting was attended by representatives from 13 Member States of the Board of Directors. Representatives of the Togolese Republic and the Republic of Indonesia attended as observers. The Secretary General briefed the Board by providing information on the activities and developments of the General Secretariat, SMIC Councils, Technical Committees, and other important activities since the 27th SMIC BOD Meeting. The Secretary General briefed the Board on the Progress Report on the Two-Year Implementation Plan (2023-2024) of SMIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030. The report was welcomed by the Board of Directors members. During the meeting, Chairs of the SMIC Councils presented their reports on the latest developments and activities.



The Secretary General briefed the Board about the membership application of the L'Agence Togolaise de Normalisation (ATN) as the national body of the Togolese Republic. The membership application was unanimously approved. After briefing by the General Secretariat and discussions, the Board approved the Two-Year Implementation Plan (2025-2026) of SMIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030. The Board also reviewed and discussed the Draft Budget for 2024 and the Report of the External Auditor for the year 2024.

Standardization Management Council is the organ assigned the task of coordinating the development of OIC/SMIIC standards in cooperation with Member States. Standardization Management Council coordinates and oversees the performance of the Technical Committees.

SMC has been diligently advancing the future initiatives of the technical committees while closely monitoring their progress on ongoing standardization projects.

In conjunction with the 19th SMIIC General Assembly Meeting, the 7th Meeting of the SMIIC Standardization Management Council was held on 11 November 2024, in Istanbul, TURKIYE. The following items were discussed:

Standardization Activities

The core business of SMIIC is to develop and publish OIC/SMIIC Standards and technical specifications that meet the evolving needs of OIC- wide businesses and other organizations. This important work brings concrete benefits, such as: *improving safety, quality, and reliability of products and services.*

SMIIC experienced a bustling year in 2024, with its technical committees diligently engaged in various standards development projects. 13th SMIIC Technical Committee (TC) Week Meetings were held on the 22-28 September 2024 in Istanbul. All committees including CCA held their plenary meetings. Online participation in the meetings was also possible for members who could not attend physically.

SMIIC Committee on Standards for Conformity Assessment (SMIIC/CCA)

OIC/SMIIC standards are developed by experts, within TCs. TCs are made up of representatives of industry, NGOs, governments, and other stakeholders, who are put forward by SMIIC's members. Each TC deals with a different subject.

TECHNICAL COMMITTEES (including CCA) activities 2024

SMIIC Committee on Standards for Conformity (CCA) has published 7 standards on conformity assessment including the recently published standard: OIC/SMIIC 57: 2022 Conformity Assessment – General Requirements for the Operation of Various Types of Bodies Performing Halal Inspection. A systematic review study of OIC/SMIIC 2:2019 and OIC/SMIIC 3:2019 standards has been initiated.

- Test Method for **detection of porcine** in Food Products and cosmetics
- Test Method for **detection of ethanol** in Food Products and cosmetics
- Maximum Limit for **Residues of Ethyl Alcohol (Ethanol)** in Food

- Halal Food Prepared by Bioprocessing Techniques prepared by **Bioprocessing Techniques**



• **TC2- Halal Cosmetic Issues** has published the OIC/SMIIC Standard on Halal Cosmetics Requirements, and the following projects are being studied:

- Definitions and Criteria for Halal Cosmetics - **Doubtful Ingredients**
- Halal **Cosmetics Claims**
- **Cleaning and Cleaning** for Halal Production and Supply Chain Facilities



• **TC3- Service Site Issues**, the following are in the work program:

- Fuel Stations
- Improving Hygiene Conditions, Infection Prevention and Control **for Educational Institutions**
- Hygiene, infection prevention, and control guidance document - **for safe service and production**



• **TC4- Energy Efficiency and Renewable Energy** has published 3 standards on “Energy Management Systems” and “Photovoltaic Module Safety Qualifications” and is currently working on **20 new projects** on Photovoltaic Systems and Energy Management Systems.



• **TC5- Tourism and Related Services** currently has 2 standards published.

- In addition to these publications, the Project on “Halal Tourism Services - **Classification for Wellness Spa**” has reached to CD Stage

Two new projects have been approved:

- **TC7- Transportation** is responsible for 1 published standard on

- **Bottom Loading Tank and Trailers**

It is currently working on 3 projects regarding: **Refrigerated transport equipment**, Trailers, and **LPG Transportation**.



- **TC8- Leather and Tanning Material** has published 8 standards including:

- **OIC/SMIIC 37:2022 Halal Products- Usage of Animal Bone, Skin and Hair- General Guidelines**

The committee is currently working on the development of the standard for the “**Requirements of Tanning Materials**” and “**Testing Technics for the Identification of Pig Skin**”.



- **TC9- Textiles and Related Products**, published the standard **OIC/SMIIC 27 on Woven Carpets used for Masjids** and 2 other standards. The standard on **Ihram Dress Specification** is under publication.

On the other hand, **Identification of Pig Hair in textile, Towels, Spring Mattress Abaya Black Chador Fabric** are some of the topics being developed by this committee currently.



- **TC10- Halal Supply Chain** published 3 parts of the standard OIC/SMIIC 17 regarding the requirements of the **Halal Supply Chain** in:

The committee is currently developing the 4th part of this standard: OIC/SMIIC WD 17- 4 Halal Supply Chain Management System - Part 4: **Port** - General Requirements.

- **Hygiene and Sanitation Management System Requirements**
- The Project on “**Islamic Ethics including anti-bribery issues**” has reached the CD Stage.



- **TC13- on Jewelry** published the standard on the General Requirements for Refined Gold. The following are the current projects:

Technical Committee Week 13 Meetings

Technical Committee Week 13 Meetings

The 13th SMIIIC Technical Committee (TC) Week was organized on 22-28 September 2024, in Istanbul, Türkiye in a hybrid format. Technical Committees including CCA held their plenary meetings with a total of 326 physical and online participants from 27 prominent organizations, representing countries including: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cameroon, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Libya, Malaysia, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Thailand, Tunisia, Türkiye, UAE, and Uganda.

Workshop on SMC Roadmap for SMIIIC Technical Work:

In addition to the meetings, in line with the SMC Resolution 05/2023-b, the “Workshop on SMC Roadmap for SMIIIC Technical Work” was organized during TC Week 13. The workshop was attended by 51 participants composed of TC Secretaries, Chairs, Committee Members, WG convenors, Liaison Representatives, and SMIIIC Technical Assistants. The workshop consisted of two sessions:

The presentation on the SMIIIC Technical Work and IT Tools was made during the first session. After presentations, the challenges to be discussed have been introduced and identified. Some of the challenges discussed are as follows:

- Enhancing stakeholder engagement in drafting standards
- Notification of adopted standards
- Following the requirements of the directives
- Developing the skills of the TC Chairs, Secretaries and Members
- Effective use of the SMIIIC Information System
- Effective project management



In the second session, the participants were divided into groups to suggest solutions to the challenges identified. The workshop was closed by the collection of the suggested solutions. The report will be prepared and published before the SMC Meeting. The plenary meetings were effective and fruitful in which Technical Committees worked on their projects and strategic business plans.

Committee on Standards for Conformity Assessment (CCA)

Committee on Standards for Conformity Assessment (CCA) has been established for preparation of guides/standards on criteria for bodies involved in testing, calibration, certification, inspection, accreditation, their operation and assessment, and other related standards and especially halal conformity assessment and accreditation guidelines or standards.



SMIIC/CCA is the committee which is responsible for the development of OIC/SMIIC standards on conformity assessment and accreditation. Within the committee, 7 OIC/SMIIC standards have already been developed in this scope of which OIC/SMIIC 2 and 3 standards are the main standards. The most recently published standard is: OIC/SMIIC 57: 2022 Conformity Assessment – General Requirements for the Operation of Various Types of Bodies Performing Halal Inspection.

The 13th Meeting of the SMIIC Committee on Standards for Conformity Assessment (SMIIC/CCA) was held on 23 September 2024 in İstanbul, Republic of Türkiye in a hybrid format.

A systematic review study of OIC/SMIIC 2:2019 and OIC/SMIIC 3:2019 standards has been initiated. The systematic review balloting process for both OIC/SMIIC 2 and 3 standards was conducted at the SMIIC Information System (SMIIC IS) from 01 February to 01 July 2024 to determine whether a maintenance procedure for OIC/SMIIC 2 and 3 standards is needed or not. After the discussions on the Systematic Review results at the 13th SMIIC/CCA Meeting, in accordance with Resolution 04/2024, SMIIC/CCA has decided to initiate the maintenance procedure (revision) for the OIC/SMIIC 2 and 3 standards as outlined in Annex B of the SMIIC Directives, Part 1. Additionally, it has been agreed to establish a maintenance team (MT) to carry out this revision process and conduct the initial study of the revision process.

SMIIC/CCA, with Resolution 06/2024 of the 13th SMIIC/CCA Meeting, decided to initiate a Committee Draft (CD) study of the Setting up a Quality Award for Islamic Countries standard project and requested all CCA members to submit their comments on SMIIC IS whether the draft should be under the SMIIC/CCA scope. In this context, the SMIIC/CCA Secretary has initiated the CD ballot on the said Project on 26 September 2024 with a deadline of 26 November 2024.

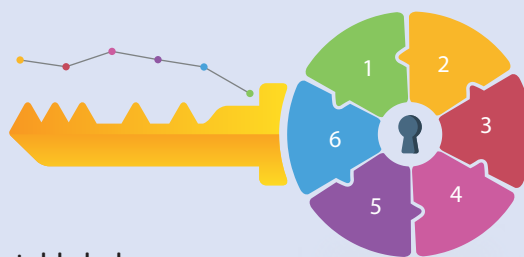
It was decided that the Advisory Study Group (ASG) continue its activities with a focus on the exchange of ideas and brainstorming on halal-related conformity assessment, accreditation, and mutual recognition considering the establishment of the Islamic Forum for Halal Accreditation Bodies (IFHAB).

It was recommended that a cooperation mechanism be established with the IFHAB for standards development within the SMIIC/CCA as well as the participation of IFHAB representatives in SMIIC/CCA meetings.

SMIIC Information System

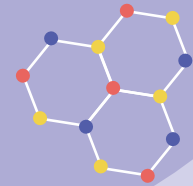
Advancing AI in Standardization

SMIIC continues to innovate by integrating AI into standardization processes. Our AI Conversation tool now provides real-time support for TC Secretaries and WG Conveners, enhancing research, drafting, translation, and summarization.

We have begun developing multiple thematic assistants for each Technical Committee. With this approach, we will have AI assistants that facilitate research, drafting, translation, and summarization. Additionally, they can assist in committee topics such as Halal Food, Cosmetics, Pharmaceuticals, Tourism, etc.

By leveraging multiple AI models, vector stores, and structured dialogue, we optimize costs while maintaining control over data ownership and storage. SMIIC remains committed to refining AI systems and modernizing standardization practices.





Metrology Council (MC)

Metrology Council is SMIIIC's operational organ for cooperation between national metrology authorities from Islamic Countries. SMIIIC MC aims to achieve uniformity in metrology and laboratory testing among Member States. MC consists of a chair and members from national metrology institutes of the Member States and Observers of SMIIIC.

Metrology Activities

Metrology as the science of measurement showed us its importance once again during the pandemic period. Metrology and laboratory services have provided an essential contribution to the diagnostic process with high-quality and accurate infrastructure. In view of this fact, we continued our metrology activities during 2024 by holding activities, meetings, and training for capacity building as per the SMIIIC MC Work Plan 2024 – 2026.

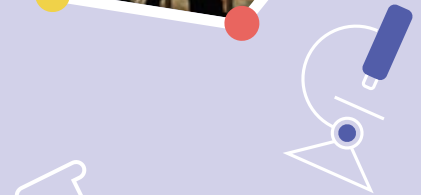
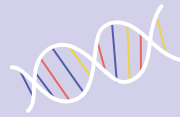
14th SMIIIC Metrology Council Meeting

15th SMIIIC Metrology Council Meeting

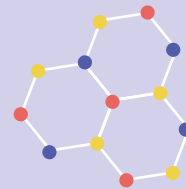
The 15th Meeting of the SMIIIC Metrology Council (MC) was held in a hybrid format on 10 November 2024 in Istanbul, Republic of Türkiye. It was hosted by the SMIIIC General Secretariat and the National Metrology Institute of Türkiye (TUBITAK UME). The meeting was attended by 60 representatives (41 physically and 19 online) from a total of 21 Members and Observer States. The representative of the GULF Association for Metrology (GULFMET) attended as a guest.

Brief summary:

During the meeting, the elections of the SMIIIC MC Chair and Vice-Chair for the term 2025–2027 were held. The Metrology Council has elected Mr. Saeed Mohammed Almheiri, Executive Director of the Emirates Metrology Institute (MOIAT/EMI), from the United Arab Emirates was elected as Chair and Mr. Abdulrahman Rashed Alaskar, Director of the Chemical Measurement Department (SASO- NMCC), from Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, was elected as the Vice – Chair of the Metrology Council (MC), both for the 2025– 2027 term.

SMIIC MC Work Plan for 2024 – 2026

The SMIIC MC, briefly, intends to harmonize and facilitate the activities in the metrology area in the Member States based on international arrangements and regional metrology organization membership requirements by organizing necessary metrological activities. The SMIIC MC aims to contribute to the enhancement of the technical and metrological capabilities of Member States and the facilitation of the removal of technical trade barriers. In line with these objectives, the SMIIC MC Work Plan 2024-2026 was prepared by the Task Force Group which was constituted during the 13th SMIIC MC meeting as per the resolution 16/2023.



The SMIIC MC Work Plan 2024-2026 covers the main activities planned for implementation by the SMIIC MC Member States for three years and is coordinated by the Metrology Council Chairmanship. The planned activities such as training, workshops, seminars, consultancies, research and development activities, etc. will be organized online and/or in person at the host NMI/DI premises with the involvement of the Members' National Metrology Institutes and Designated Institutes. This plan may be subject to intermediate revision once a year in case new requirements are received from the Members and this will be made at the end of every year as a preparation for the upcoming new year.

SMIIC MC Projects

SMIIC Interlaboratory Comparisons (ILCs)

The SMIIC Metrology Council started Inter-laboratory Comparisons (ILC) in accordance with Resolution 19/2022 from the 11th SMIIC MC meeting convened on October 28-29, 2022, in Almaty, Kazakhstan. The comparison areas were decided in accordance with the Member states highest priority. The Technical Protocol for Interlaboratory Comparisons (ILCs) has been circulated, and funding for these ILC activities has been provided by the SMIIC General Secretariat. SMIIC MC Inter-laboratory Comparisons (ILCs) have been commenced in November 2023 for Mass, Temperature, and Pressure and are continuing. Online workshops and/or meetings were coordinated by the pilot laboratories. The transfer standards were arranged and are getting ready for comparisons by the pilot laboratories.

SMIIC MC R&D Project Program

During the 10th SMIIC MC Meeting, the Metrology Council decided to conduct Research and Development Projects for capacity building of the MC Members and asked for possible financial resources from the SMIIC budget as per Metrology Council Resolution 07/2022. A Task Force Group (TFG) to evaluate submitted projects and coordinate the R&D Project Program was created during the 12th SMIIC MC Meeting. The TFG members were selected from Category 1 countries and consist of members from: Egypt, Indonesia, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, Türkiye, Uzbekistan, and the SMIIC General Secretariat as per Metrology Council Resolution 11/2023. The Task Force group held 4 meetings. The criteria of the Referee Board have been determined by the TFG and members for the Referee Board have been requested from the member states. The 13 Projects submitted in 2023 to be supported by the SMIIC GS were sent to the referees for evaluation. The evaluation process of the 2023 Call has been completed and the related budget (100.000 USD) has been requested from SMIIC GS to fund the selected project(s). The SMIIC MC R&D projects program has not started yet due to a lack of funding.



SMIIC MC Guide in Medical Metrology

During the 12th SMIIC MC Meeting, it was decided to establish a Working Group (WG) to work on a Medical Metrology Standard/Guide for Legal Metrology Purposes. The working group is studying the medical devices used and will form a guide for verification of the medical devices used in the OIC. The working group experts have been assigned from: Bosnia & Herzegovina, Iraq, Iran, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Türkiye, and Uzbekistan as per SMIIC Metrology Council Resolution 06/2023 and Sudan has been added to the WG as per SMIIC Metrology Council Resolution 23/2023 during the 13th SMIIC Metrology Council Meeting. The WG already held four meetings. Ultimately a draft guide in Legal/Medical Metrology will be developed.

SMIIC Metrology Council Technical Capacity Building Trainings:

The trainings in the SMIIC MC Work Plan 2024-2026 were conducted online by the host National Metrology Institutes. The training requirements were planned to be covered by volunteer members (Training fields and details are presented in the SMIIC MC Work Plan 2024 - 2026).

All trainings were coordinated by TÜBİTAK UME as the NMI holding the SMIIC MC Chairmanship and SMIIC General Secretariat. Information about the 16 (sixteen) trainings successfully realized via the Zoom platform is given in the table below.

Accreditation Council (AC)

According to the Article 6.5.6 of the SMIIC Statute, AC is the organ carrying out activities aimed at the establishment of an accreditation scheme in the OIC Member States. AC is responsible for supporting actions for establishing a sound accreditation system OIC-wide and raise awareness of accreditation concept within the Member States.

The Accreditation Council (AC) consists of members from national accreditation bodies authorized by Member States and Observers of SMIIC. The chair and 12 members from national accreditation bodies authorized by Member States shall be appointed or elected by the Board of Directors for the management of AC, on the basis of an equitable geographic distribution, in accordance with the Rules of Procedure.

The composition of the Members of the Management of SMIIC AC for the 2022-2024 term which was determined at the 22nd SMIIC Board of Directors on 01 November 2021 in Al-Madinah Al- Munawarah, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is:

- 3) Islamic Republic of IRAN
- 4) Republic of IRAQ
- 5) Hashemite Kingdom of JORDAN

On the other hand, the 12 (twelve) new Members of the Management of SMIIC AC (MAC) for the 2025-2027 term have been determined at the 28th SMIIC Board of Directors Meeting on 12 November 2024 in İstanbul, Republic of Türkiye and the information of new members is available via <https://www.smiic.org/en/accreditation-council-ac>

General Concept

The cooperation between the Standards and Metrology Institute for Islamic Countries (SMIIC) and the Islamic Forum for Halal Accreditation Bodies (IFHAB) represents a critical step toward global harmonization of halal conformity assessment and accreditation. IFHAB's recognition as an affiliated organization of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) through Resolution No. 8/49-LO at the 49th Session of the Council of Foreign Ministers in March 2023 marks a milestone in halal accreditation efforts within the OIC Member States.



IFHAB's primary goal is to develop and maintain a Multilateral Recognition Arrangement (MRA) among national halal accreditation bodies of OIC Member States. This cooperation will promote mutual recognition of halal certificates issued in compliance with OIC/SMIIC standards, facilitating seamless intra-OIC trade and allowing halal-certified products to move freely across Member States without the need for re-certification. By reducing costs and simplifying procedures, this arrangement will stimulate the expansion of halal trade across the OIC region.

This collaboration will ensure uniformity, credibility, and trustworthiness in halal certification, with consistent application of OIC/SMIIC standards across accreditation bodies. It will enhance global confidence in halal products certified within the OIC region, leading to greater harmonization of halal standards and accreditation systems worldwide and further facilitating international halal trade.

Moreover, this partnership will support economic growth within OIC Member States by eliminating technical barriers and streamlining certification processes, thereby strengthening trade relations and contributing to the overall development of the halal economy. Ultimately, cooperation between SMIIC and IFHAB will establish a robust halal-quality infrastructure, promoting the free movement of halal goods and sustainable economic development across the Islamic world.

In this context, a draft Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was communicated to the Secretariat of IFHAB on 6 March 2024, following Board Resolution 22/2023 of the 26th SMIIC Board of Directors Meeting. The MOU aims to formalize cooperation between SMIIC and IFHAB, focusing on halal conformity assessment policy and the development of OIC/SMIIC standards related to halal accreditation. The official partnership between these sister OIC institutions will ensure that products certified under OIC/SMIIC standards and accredited by IFHAB MRA signatories can move freely across OIC Member States without re-certification.

Latest Developments

The Task Force Group (TFG) of the SMIIC Accreditation Council (AC) was directed by the Management of SMIIC AC, through Accreditation Council Resolution 13/2023, to develop certification schemes in the halal domain based on OIC/SMIIC standards for implementation by the Islamic Forum for Halal Accreditation Bodies (IFHAB). This directive follows Board of Directors Resolution 08/2023 from the 25th SMIIC Board of Directors Meeting, which confirmed SMIIC AC's role in this matter.

On 21 December 2023, the Chair and members of the TFG were formally notified to commence drafting the certification scheme documents. As part of this effort, the TFG prepared two draft documents: *Process Requirements for IFHAB Members* and *Resource Management Guideline for IFHAB Members*.

The 5th Meeting of the TFG of the SMIIC AC was held virtually on 2 October 2024 to review the comments received from the members for these documents. During the meeting, members of the TFG agreed to submit them for consideration at the 7th Meeting of the Management of SMIIC AC.

SMIIC Training Activities

One of the Strategic Priorities (Goals) of SMIIC is "Support the enhancement of quality infrastructure and interconnectivity of members", in order to achieve our goal, we work to support our members in improving their infrastructure by giving training in different fields: metrology, standards and accreditation, with a special focus on OIC/SMIIC Standards and Directives/SMIIC Information Systems training. We continued to conduct various training activities in 2024 both virtually and physically, some of these are mentioned below:

The objective of the standard is to describe the fundamentals of halal quality Management certification and provide guidelines for understanding, developing, operating, or maintaining certification schemes for halal quality management systems. The training program included:

- Requirements and implementation of the OIC/SMIIC 18
- Question and answer session
- An evaluation test on OIC/SMIIC 18



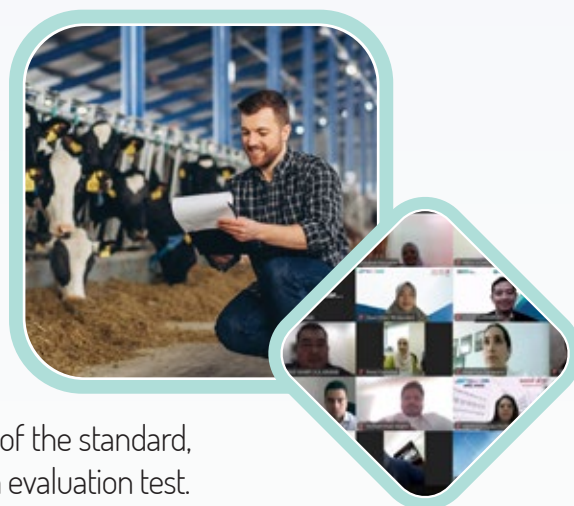
3. OIC/SMIIC 23:2022 Standard for Feeding Stuffs for Halal Animals Foundation Training

SMIIC successfully conducted a virtual foundation training on the "OIC/SMIIC 23: 2022 Feeding Stuffs for Halal Animals – General Requirements standard" on August 05 - 06, 2024. The training was attended by 41 experts from 17 member states.

Notably, OIC/SMIIC 23: 2022 is the first standard of its kind within the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) countries, setting a benchmark for Feeding Stuffs for Halal Animals. This training marks the inaugural session dedicated to this significant standard, reflecting SMIIC's commitment to advancing the use of halal standards across its member states.

The training focused on the fundamental requirements outlined in the OIC/SMIIC 23 standard, which governs all stages of feed preparation or production, including receiving, sorting, mixing, processing, and distribution of materials intended for halal animal feeding, all in accordance with Islamic rules.

The program covered a wide range of topics, including the history of OIC/SMIIC 23, an introduction to animal feed, types and categories of animal feed, implementation of the standard, and concluded with a question-and-answer session and an evaluation test.

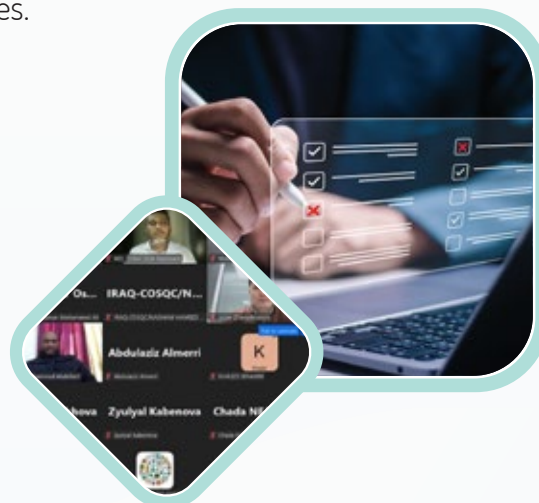


4. OIC/SMIIC 3:2019 Conformity Assessment - Requirements for Halal Accreditation Bodies Accrediting Halal Conformity Assessment Bodies

OIC/SMIIC 3:2019 Conformity Assessment - Requirements for Halal Accreditation Bodies Accrediting Halal Conformity Assessment Bodies - English was given virtually on 02-03 December 2024. 28 experts from 10 Member States attended the training.

OIC/SMIIC 3:2019 standard prescribes general guidance and procedures for the halal accreditation body assessing and accrediting halal conformity assessment bodies (HCABs). It is also appropriate as a requirements document for the peer evaluation process for mutual recognition arrangements between halal accreditation bodies of OIC Member States.

The training gave the foundation knowledge regarding the content and implementation of the standard. The training included an exam and certificates of successful completion were given to participants who passed the necessary assessment.



5. OIC/SMIIC 24:2020 General Requirements for Food Additives and Other Added Chemicals to Halal Food Training

Training on the OIC/SMIIC 24:2020 General Requirements for Food Additives and Other Added Chemicals to Halal Food was given in Arabic for experts from Arabic-speaking Member States on 09- 10 December 2024. The 41 experts attended from 11 countries attended the training.

OIC/SMIIC 24:2020 standard sets the requirements and conditions needed for food additives and any other added chemicals (processing aids, flavorings, added nutrients, enzymes) used during food production to ensure that the final product is halal and safe to consume in OIC countries and all over the world.

OIC/SMIIC 24:2020 standard defines the halal status of food additives in foodstuffs intended for human consumption. It sets a list of doubtful and non-halal food additives and the needed action for each of them.

2. OIC/SMIIC 4: Halal Cosmetics Training in French, for French Speaking Countries

SMIIC conducted the OIC/SMIIC 4:2018 Halal Cosmetics – General Requirements Training in French on 04-05 March 2024 virtually. 40 participants from French-speaking member states (Chad, Gabon, Guinea, Morocco, Niger, Senegal, and Tunisia) attended the training.

The training aimed to give the foundation knowledge regarding Halal cosmetics, the Halal industry, requirements, and implementation of the OIC/SMIIC 4:2018 Halal Cosmetics – General Requirements.



3. OIC/SMIIC 1: 2019 General Requirements for Halal Food – Auditor Training in French, for French-Speaking Countries

SMIIC conducted the OIC/SMIIC 1:2019 General Requirements for Halal Food – Auditor Training in French, for French Speaking Countries on 08-10 July 2024 virtually. 25 participants from French-speaking member states (Cameroon, Djibouti, Morocco, Senegal, and Tunisia) attended the training.

The training aimed to give the foundation knowledge regarding Halal auditing according to OIC/SMIIC 1, the Halal industry, requirements, and implementation of the OIC/SMIIC 1:2019 as an auditor.



4. COMSTECH-SMIIC Training Course on “OIC/SMIIC Halal Products Standards and Testing: Food, Pharmaceuticals and Cosmetics” was held between 20-24 May 2024 Rabat and Mohammedia, Kingdom of Morocco in Arabic, for the Arabic Speaking Countries

The official opening of the training course was honored by the attendance of Ms. Ouezzani Amina, Ministry of Industry and Trade, and Mr. El Houszein MIFRAH, High Council of Ulama of the Kingdom of Morocco. The representatives of ICDT and ICESCO also attended the opening session as the sister organizations of the OIC.

The training course included the following technical sessions:

- OIC/SMIIC 1:2019 – General Requirements for Halal Food
- Auditing of Testing Labs in line with OIC/SMIIC 35 – Conformity Assessment – General Requirements for the Competence of Laboratories Performing Halal Testing.

The training program also included two-day field training on the testing procedures standards such as the test method for detecting porcine in Food Products (meat, processed food, and gelatin) being chosen by the SMIIC TC1 Technical Committee for Halal food issues, this practical part took place in a Moroccan laboratory specialized in the field of analysis of halal products.

OIC/SMIIC 1 training was attended in hybrid mode by around 50 (fifty) students from different Arabic countries while OIC/SMIIC 35 training was attended by around 15 students from different 8 (eight) Arabic countries especially from: Comoros, Iraq, Mauritania, Morocco, Oman, Palestine, Somalia and Tunisia.

10th World Halal Summit and Halal Expo 2024- Istanbul

10th World Halal Summit

COMSTECH-SMIIC Training Course on "OIC/SMIIC Halal Products Standards and Testing: Food, Pharmaceuticals and Cosmetics" was held between 20–24 May 2024 in Rabat and Mohammedia, Kingdom of Morocco, for Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) and SMIIC members in the Arab region, in partnership with COMSTECH Secretariat and Institute Marocain de Normalisation (IMANOR) to encourage the harmonization of halal standards used in the OIC Member States and internationally by aiding in the adoption and use of the OIC/SMIIC halal standards, also transfer experience as well as equip participants with the latest analytic skills in halal testing.

SMiIC has signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the International Trade Center (ITC), the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE), United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), African Organisation for Standardisation (ARSO), Arab Industrial Development, Standardization and Mining Organization (AIDSMO), GCC Standardization Organization (GSO), the GCC Accreditation Center (GAC) and Arab Accreditation Cooperation (ARAC). During 2024, we strengthened our cooperation and coordination with sister organizations in the OIC family: International Islamic Fiqh Academy (IIFA), Islamic Centre for Development of Trade (ICDT), Statistical, Economic and Social Research and Training Centre for Islamic Countries (SESRIC), Islamic Chamber of Commerce and Development (ICCD), Islamic Organization for Food Security (IOFS) and Ministerial Standing Committee on Scientific and Technological Cooperation of the OIC (COMSTECH). SMiIC has signed an MOU with Universiti Teknologi Mara (UITM), the Islamic University in Uganda (IUIU), and the International Islamic Fiqh Academy (IIFA).

SMiIC is also in dialogue with ISO, WTO, and WIPO.



PROGRESSING TOWARDS OUR 2030 VISION

“SMIIC STRATEGIC PLAN 2021-2030”

Our new SMIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030 became effective on the 1st of January 2021, after its approval during the 15th SMIIC General Assembly in November 2020. The approved Strategic Plan gives the general framework plan towards achieving our vision and accomplishment of our high strategic goals.

SMIIC overarching vision has become: **creating a quality infrastructure that improves economy, and welfare and protects its Member States.**

SMIIC's Strategic Plan identifies three high-level goals to guide the Institute toward its vision:

- Develop high-quality standards that are used worldwide.
- Support members' needs and ensure effective engagement of their stakeholders.
- Support the enhancement of quality infrastructure and interconnectivity of members.

Revision of SMIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030

The SMIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030 provides a comprehensive framework for achieving our organizational vision over an extended period. To facilitate the effective execution of this plan, it was agreed that it would be supported by Two-Year Implementation Plans

As we approach the conclusion of the second Two-Year Implementation Plan for 2023-2024, which ends on December 31, 2024, it has become imperative to review and refine our strategic direction. During the 4th meeting of the SMIIC Board of Directors/Strategic Committee (BOD/SC) held on October 30, 2023, in Makkah, Saudi Arabia, a Task Force Group (TFG) was established. This group, comprising representatives from Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, and Iran, and chaired by Jordan, has been tasked with reviewing the SMIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030 alongside the General Survey for Measuring Member States' Satisfaction Degree.

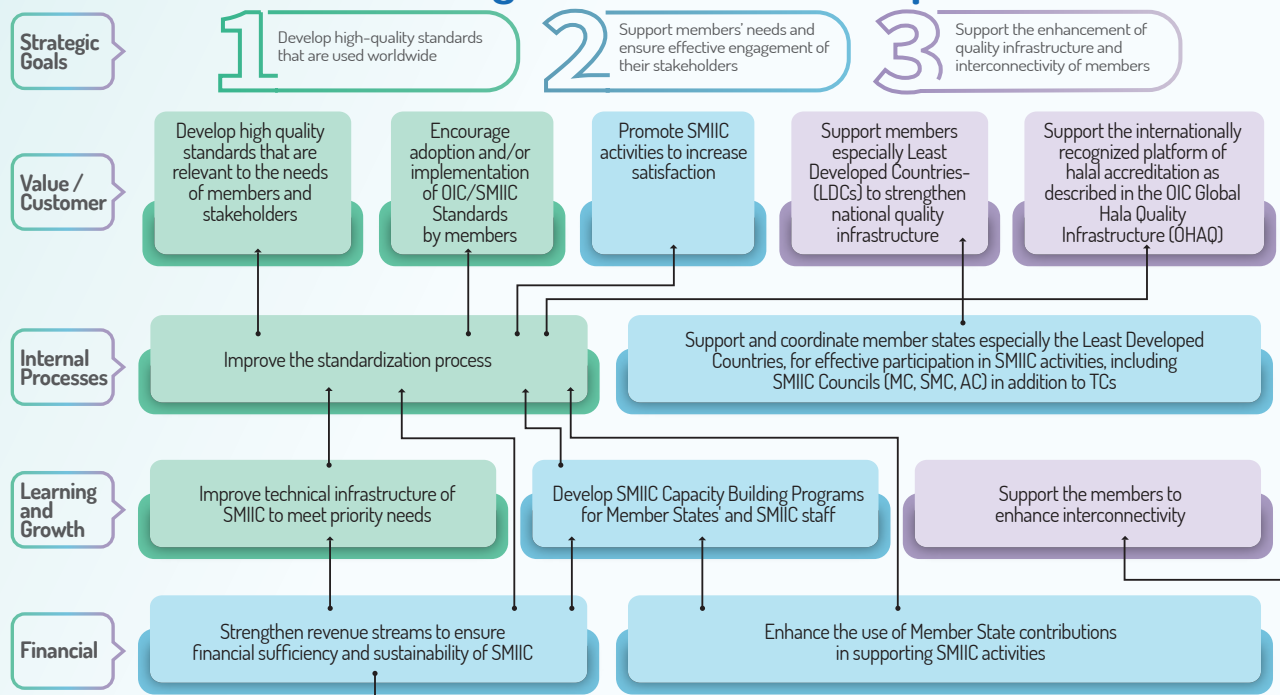
The first meeting of the BOD/SC/TFG took place on November 30, 2023, where several key topics were identified for review and revision within the Strategic Plan for 2021-2030:

- Strategic Objectives
- Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)
- Strategic Initiatives.

Over the course of eight virtual meetings, which concluded on 8 March 2024, the BOD/SC/TFG conducted a thorough review of the SMIIC Strategic Plan and finalized the revision of the SMIIC Strategic Plan 2021-2030. Subsequently, the SMIIC General Secretariat circulated the document to all SMIIC Member States for comments on 1 August 2024, with a deadline set for 31 August 2024. On 18 September 2024, the TFG held a virtual meeting to discuss the comments received from Member States. Following this discussion, the SMIIC General Secretariat reviewed all submitted comments and circulated them back to each Member State separately, providing the final status of their respective feedback.

The final mid-term review resulted in the identification of **12** strategic objectives, **18** initiatives, and **26** key performance indicators (KPIs) to measure progress, as well as **18** strategic initiatives aimed at achieving the three overarching goals of SMIIC.

1. Expert engagement:

326 experts from SMIIIC Member States and IIFA participated and contributed to the technical work during the 13th SMIIIC Technical Committee Week Meetings.



The 13th SMIIIC Technical Committee (TC) Week was organized on 22-28 September 2024, in Istanbul, Türkiye in a hybrid format. Technical Committees including CCA held their plenary meetings with a total of 326 physical and online participants from 27 prominent organizations, representing countries including Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Bangladesh, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Cameroon, Egypt, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Libya, Malaysia, Morocco, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Thailand, Tunisia, Türkiye, UAE, and Uganda.

2. Online Sales:

The online sales system of OIC/SMIIIC standards on the SMIIIC website which was launched in 2017 has become more dynamic during 2024 recording 147 (One hundred and forty-seven) standards being purchased from all around the world.
